YMCA Centre for Life Project Nears Construction Start


Construction on the much-anticipated YMCA Centre for Life is set to begin by early fall, with the project's design nearing completion and several key sub-contracts secured. TaskForce Engineering, the firm leading the project, announced that a 60% design review will be finalized in August, marking a critical step forward in the development process.

With a building permit expected soon, groundbreaking is anticipated by early October. The first major construction milestone will be pouring the pool before winter, allowing the structure's framework to be erected during the colder months. The project remains on track for completion by the end of the first guarter of 2026. A notable change in the project is the building's orientation, which has been adjusted to face a yet-to-be-named road instead of Bridge Street as originally planned. This redesign reflects the integration of the Centre for Life into the City of Belleville's broader infrastructure plan.

In a positive turn for the budget, current pricing conditions are more competitive than a year ago, helping to keep the project on track financially. Key sub-contractors have been finalized: Quality Mechanical for mechanical work, Diamond Mechanical for electrical, and Acapulco Pools for the pool installation. Additional sub-contracts are expected to go out for tender in the coming months. The YMCA Centre for Life will serve as a vital hub for health, wellness, and community connection in Belleville.
